Nobody, Wavy Gravy Hit UNM

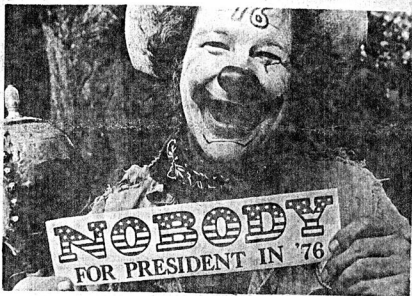
Students will rally for Nobody for President at noon today on the UNM Mall, said Ken Kietzke, "non-spokesman" for the Slumber Party, a newly-chartered campus organization, which is sponsoring the rally.

Wavy Gravy and the Nobody for President campaign party arrived in Albuquerque Sunday on the Southwestern leg of an election effort that will culminate in New York City on Nov. 2.

Nobody will be present at the rally to deliver a campaign address, Kietzke said. Wavy Gravy and others from San Francisco's Hog Farm commune, which is responsible for the election-year tour, will also be taking an active part in the effort.

The Hog Farm visited UNM once before, on the 1968 campaign trail. As a result of that visit, Kietzke said, the administration saw fit to enact a few new regulations governing the use of vehicles in public events on the mall.

Nobody, Gravy, and others are expected to focus their speeches on the central theme of the campaign:

"Nobody cares." Other appeals to voter sympathy incorporated into their election strategy include such slogans as "Nobody will lower your taxes" and "Nobody will end war."

Nobody has broad popular support and stands a good chance of winning the election, said campaign sources. Gravy pointed

out at a San Francisco rally that 40 per cent of eligible voters in the last presidential election voted for nobody.

Jimmy Carter, himself, recently endorsed the candidate, Kietzke said, when in a campaign speech he (Carter) told the assembled throng, "Nobody has all the answers..."
