## 'Nobody for President' campaign coming here

Wavy Gravy, the clown prince of Haight Ashbury and the master of ceremonies at the Woodstock Festival, comes to Ann Arbor for three days beginning Valentine's Day, to bring his "Nobody for President" campaign to the American heartland.

While some journalists charge that Gravy's quest takes nothing seriously, this leads him to deny it, claiming that he takes "Nobody" seriously.

The first night in town will see Gravy, 47, speaking in the Michigan Union's Pendelton Room on the subjects of "Change" and "Survival With a Sense of Humor," as well as "Nobody."

Tongue firmly in cheek (we think), Gravy sloganeers for the candidate with such double-edged campaign cheers as "Nobody is the peace candidate," "Nobody knows all the answers" and "Nobody understands foreign policy." The bumper-stickers read "U.S. Out of North America."

This is Nobody's third Presidential campaign, and Gravy (a.k.a. Hugh Romney) has stuck faithfully by him throughout as Nobody's Fool. Mostly, his campaign has drawn bemused re-
